By equipping community-based institutions and schools with curricular, academic, and organizational resources, we facilitate the execution of extraordinary summer learning programs. We employ and train top teachers, professionals, high school and college students to help them do it. In 2017, SummerCollab received the National Summer Learning Association's Excellence Award for our innovative and impactful approach to making summer smarter.

Through our alliances with community partners, cultural institutions, and schools, we engage Delaware's highest need youth in dynamic, effective learning that meet precise literacy deficits, grow critical thinking skills, and deepen sense of self. Research shows that more time for learning is essential to catch students up and accelerate learning. **Summer learning** and **high-dosage** tutoring have emerged as two of the top K-12 funding priorities nationwide based on their impact on social, emotional, and academic success. **SummerCollab's programs meet both priorities.**

The unmet need is high...

Delaware families want smart, accessible out-of-school time programs.

- 75% of parents say that it is important to them that a summer experience helps keep their child from losing academic ground
- 97% of parents report that opportunities to **build life skills** was important in selecting their child's structured summer experience
- 97% of parents report that programs offering a variety of activities was important in selecting their child's structured summer experience
- 91% of parents support **public funding** for summer learning opportunities

28,281 Delaware children (25%) are not in a summer program would be enrolled if a program were available to them.

According to the CDC, **educational access and quality has health impacts** too. "Children from low-income families, children with disabilities, and children who routinely experience forms of social discrimination — like bullying — are more likely to struggle with math and reading. They're also less likely to graduate from high school or go to college. This means they're less likely to get safe, high-paying jobs and more likely to have health problems like heart disease, diabetes, and depression."

SUMMER LITCORPS READING BUDDIES



Summer Literacy Corps provides 1:1 reading sessions to rising 1st-5th graders at their regularly scheduled camp site. Students meet with their Reading Buddy (Summer Literacy Corps Members) for 30 minutes a day, 4 days a week, for 6 weeks. The program helps students strengthen skills in reading comprehension, fluency, vocabulary, phonics, and phonemic/ phonological awareness through a diverse set of high quality, grade appropriate picture books.

This summer, 17 incredible Summer Literacy Corps Members provided 1:1 reading acceleration to 163 elementary students. Our elementary students, and Corps Members diligently worked together by joining one another at their prospective summer camps from our partner sites-The Latin American Community Center, Hilltop Lutheran Center, Southbridge Neighborhood House, and Rodney Street Tennis Association. Our in-person model allowed us to have our Literacy Corps Members serve students in communities that had limited access to literacy and reading of diverse backgrounds.

While our Corps Members had access to a virtual learning hub where they would access the first 2 weeks of lesson plans, all of our sessions were held in-person. Corps Members were on site at camps to provide literacy instruction to our scholars.

Through the support and coaching of our seasoned Literacy Coaches, Literacy Corps Members provided targeted instruction to build up foundational skills while getting a head start on the skills needed for their next school year which supported the increase of background knowledge for our scholars. Each lesson focused on phonemic awareness, phonics, vocabulary acquisition, fluency, and comprehension strategies. Our exciting curriculum took students through a reading journey across Space, Under the Sea, into the worlds of Music, Cooking, Sports, and Poetry- even writing and performing their original poems! Students saw themselves and their communities reflected in the diverse literature; paired with the excitement and mentorship of our Corps Members, students were ready to return to school feeling confident, capable, and excited to read!

Tyler's Camps are SummerCollab's 1st-8th grade summer learning programs, which welcome students from diverse backgrounds and interests to engage in exploratory and educational programming. At Tyler's Camp, we execute inspiring, confidence-building experiences that fuel student motivation and success during the academic school year.

Tyler's Camp was founded as a place where student choice, voice and self direction are priority. Kids are defined by their interests and each one has their own unique sense of curiosity.

- Kids explore their passions, curiosities, and interests, whether it means painting, sculpting, music, performing in a play, dance or athletics
- SummerLabs feature STEM-centered programs that bring hands-on experiences with 21st Century Skills and technologies to campers

The summer of 2022 allowed us to expand our camps to include campers as young as 1st grade. We were able to continue with fully in-person programming through our ongoing relationship with Colonial School District. Programs were run at three locations:

- Eisenberg Elementary (4th-5th grade)
- William Penn High (1st-5th grade)
- George Read Middle (6th-8th grade)

The Tyler's Camp staff team provided an exciting summer experience for 205 campers this year. Literacy and social emotional learning were woven in their daily enrichment activities that included art, photography/videography, athletics, STEM, dance, cooking, and music. Allowing campers to choose the activities that excited them the most is truly what made this summer special. As Tyler's Camp looks to future summers, we are preparing to embrace camper choice by expanding their options and implementing a "Try It Out" Day where all campers can experience their options before making their choice.

Community Mentor Network (CMN) is a coordinated strategy that provides year-round targeted 1:1 social-emotional learning and mentoring support for students in first through eighth grade who have experienced unprecedented learning and socio-emotional loss due to Covid.

During the 2021-2022 school year, mentor-tutors met with their mentees in-person or virtual with one of our six community partner sites. Youth and mentors both grew as they worked through character development skills and concepts such as growth mindset development, responsible decision making, relationship skills, social and self-awareness. Academic tutoring was also incorporated as mentors provided homework help and read books with their mentees. The literacy lessons are designed to capture student interest and are tailored to individual reading levels.

The mentor-tutor team grew considerably once we shifted toward the summer as college students headed home to Delaware and schoolteachers looked for meaningful ways to share their expertise and passion for youth development. Community Mentor Network partnered with six summer camps throughout the state of Delaware to provide mentoring services to an additional 174 youth. Mentors met with their mentees for one hour throughout the camp day and created an engaging and empowering safe space, ripe for learning. During this time, students developed much needed social and emotional skills to aid in their transition for the following school year.

At the close of the summer, 80 campers registered to continue receiving the supportive work of CMN mentors for the upcoming school year. While many college level mentor-tutors returned to their outof-state campuses, they have continued working virtually with the students they bonded with over the summer. The invaluable impact of mentorship has been felt and word has spread to friends, family, and neighbors as caregivers continue to register their children to be paired with mentor-tutors from Community Mentor Network.

COLLAB CONSULTING & CAPACITY BUILDING



SummerCollab helps community centers and partners execute Out-of-School Time programs serving low-income youth by offering comprehensive training opportunities for front-line out-of-school time staff. Our vendors offer a variety of staff development packages that meet the diverse priorities of our partners. We work with each partner to design and run a program that meets their needs. Partners have the option to select additional support services that will meet local requirements and manage the completion of obtaining their qualifications.

During the summer of 2022, we had the opportunity to partner with United Way and the Governor's office through the Governor's Fellows Program. During this partnership, 39 high school students were trained in topics that included a variety of games and camp songs, the importance of summer camp, exploring their "why" and vision, being a professional role model, growth mindset, camp staff expectations, positive behavior management, self-care, developmentally appropriate practice, and best practices for safety/supervision. Once camp counselors were trained, they returned to their respective camps across all counties in the state of Delaware to engage in paid positions as Day Camp Counselors. This allowed programs to expand their capacity for low-income youth.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT INFO

SummerCollab's transformational work in the community is only possible through our talented, committed, and passionate workforce. Each year, we employ and train hundreds of local community members, from high school students to veteran teachers, all of whom are essential to fulfilling our mission.

Our workforce development aims to place into work and upskill community members at varying levels of professional experience. In our network, they take on roles that will enhance summer programming at partner agencies and our own programs with the potential to unleash positive outcomes for kids. This entails targeted recruitment through schools and civic organizations, and precise training on both specific content areas and general best practices.

We specifically recruit a young workforce from the same community we serve. This has the dual purpose of key professional development for an underserved population, and provides our children with role models to whom they can relate. We also prioritize engagement with rising school leaders, who gain critical administrative experience and a deeper connection with their kids/community. Through our current programming, those in the community are given a multitude of options in which they can join the SummerCollab team while positively impacting youth. Whether you have a passion for working in small groups with youth on social emotional or literacy activities or a desire to care for larger groups of campers as they explore new learning opportunities.

- Extend collaborative program/consulting services to the tri-state area to share our learning and magnify our impact.
